

# Faye D. McKeighan, 79

**HARLAN** — Faye D. McKeighan, daughter of Robert and Margaret (Maggie) Duhling Dent, was born at Woodward, Okla., on July 23, 1889. At age 5 she moved with her parents to a farm in Shelby county. She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm. On Dec. 19, 1916, she married Glen McCord at her home near Kirkman. One son was born to this union.

They farmed near Harlan until retiring in 1961 and moving to Harlan. After Glen's death in Nov. of 1963, Faye continued to make her home in Harlan. On March 18, 1966, she married Ralph McKeighan in Fairmont, Minn. They made their home in Fairmont. It was here that she died on Wednesday, May 30, 1979, at age 79 years, 10 months and 7 days.

Mrs McKeighan had currently been serving as president of the Women's Relief Corp. in Fairmont. She was also a member of the American Legion Auxiliary, the Community Hospital Auxiliary, and the Christian Women's Assn, all in Fairmont. She had continued her membership in the Church of Christ in Harlan.

In addition to her parents and Glen, she was preceded in death by a brother, Gorden Dent. Her survivors include her husband, Ralph McKeighan, of Fairmont, Minn., her son, Robert B. McCord of Harlan; four grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren, by two brothers - Glen Dent of Onawa and Boyd Dent of Harlan; three sisters - Doris (Mrs Hoyt Tague) and Lovie (Mrs Raymond Fiscus), of Harlan and Lotia Fiscus of Marion; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Olson Funeral Chapel in Fairmont, Minn., on Friday, June 1, 1979, with Mr Allen Burnham officiating and Otis Ayers, Albert Borowiak, Clyde Gilbaugh, Henry Hinrichs, Donald Pierce and Edward Sathoff serving as casketbearers.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Saturday, June 2, 1979, with Mr Edwin A. Boggs of the Harlan Church of Christ, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Gayle Campbell, Philip Daringer, Lynn Dent, Fred Holloway, Gary W. Jorgensen, D.C., and Bill Lambert serving as casketbearers.
