

THE LIFE STORY OF —

George G. McIntosh, 92

George Glen McIntosh, son of Emily Tilton and Henry L. McIntosh was born June 24, 1886 in Irwin. He died at Anoka Maple Manor Nursing Home in Anoka, Minn., on Tuesday, May 1, 1979 at age 92 years, 10 months and 7 days. He grew to adulthood in Irwin graduating from Irwin high school in 1904. He married Daisy M. Claessins on Jan. 22, 1908 and to this union four daughters were born. After their marriage he taught in rural schools near Irwin then worked as a telegraph operator. Later he worked for Booth Motor Co. and managed their garage at Irwin, then became a tank man for Standard Oil Co. The family moved to Odebolt in 1922 where he was a Standard Oil tankman then in 1928 they moved to Minneapolis, Minn., where they resided until moving to a nursing home in June, 1977. In 1974 he received his 50 year membership pin from the Odebolt Chapter of AF & A.M. On Jan. 22, 1979 they celebrated their 71st wedding anniversary.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a sister, Pearl; three daughter, Wilma, Mrs Clarence Johnson (Opal), Mrs Orville Bakke, (Virginia). Survivors include his wife and one daughter, Mrs Robert Paulsen of Harlan and five grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at Thurston-Lindberg Funeral Home in Anoka, Minn., on Saturday, May 5, 1979 with Rev. Douglas Pearson, officiating. Burial was in Forest Hill Cemetery in Anoka.
