MRS HARVEY PASH, 86

Mamie Ethel Pash, daughter of Albert and Sarah Turney Field, was born Sept. 3, 1887 in Galesburg, Kans. She died at Burgess Memorial hospital in Onawa, on May 15, 1974 at age 86 years, 8 months, 12 days. As a small child she moved with her parents to Coffey, Mo., where she grew to adulthood. She married Harvey Pash on Aug. 19, 1903. 15 children were born to this union. Mr and Mrs Pash were privileged to observe their 70th wedding anniversary in August of 1973. After their marriage they farmed near Coffey, Mo. From 1926 to 1931 they lived in Lock Springs, Mo. They then moved to a farm east of Defiance, where they lived until the spring of 1933. At this time they moved to Harlan and this has been their home, except for a short time during WWII when they lived in California. In 1969 they became residents of the Elmwood Nursing Home in Onawa.

Mrs Pash was preceded in death by her daughter, Edna Rhea, who died at the age of 15 months, and one sister - Clara (Mrs Jason Adams). She is survived by her husband, Harvey, of Onawa; by seven sons - Stacy of Las Vegas, Nev., Ora J. of Denver, Colo.; Truman of Placentia, Calif.; Harvey Nelson of Rosamond, Calif.; Ira Dale of Onawa; Loren Donald of Las Vegas, Nev., and Olin M. OF Harlan; by seven daughters - Hazel (Mrs Charles Schroeder) of Denver, Colo.; Lillian (Mrs Jens M. Jensen) of Co. Bluffs, Doris (Mrs William McCarty) of West Cliff, Colo.; Dorothy (Mrs Frank Benicasa) of Oakland, Calif.; Lefa (Mrs Paul W. Somerville) of Co. Bluffs,; Leta (Mrs E. S.
