MRS E.M. ROSSEAN, 74

Blanche Rossean, daughter of Rhoda and John G. Bolin, was born June 24, 1899 in Jonesboro, Tenn. She died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on June 1, 1974, just 23 days before her 75th birthday. When she was three years old she moved with her parents to Atchinson County, Mo., where she grew to adulthood. On Dec. 28, 1918 she married Estill M. Rossean in Sydney. Seven children were born to this union. Mr and Mrs Rossean were privileged to observe their 55th wedding anniversary last Dec. After their marriage they lived in Hamburg, until 1945 when they moved to Harlan. This has been their home since that time.

Mrs Rossean was preceded in death by one son - Estill, Jr.; by her parents; one brother - Merrill Bolin; and one sister - Mae Bolin.
