

CLARA M. STEWART

Clara Marie Stewart, the daughter of Chris N. and Anna K. (Mattsen) Jensen, was born on a farm near Poplar, Iowa, on January 27, 1900.

She was baptized and confirmed at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church at Jacksonville.

She attended country school and grew to adulthood on her parent's farm.

After her mother died, she moved to Harlan where she worked as a telephone operator. In 1929, she attended Beautician School and then worked with her sister in Minnie's Beauty Shop. She retired in 1972 and continued to make her home in Harlan. In April of 1978, Clara became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan and this has been her home since that time.

She died at the Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, Iowa, on August 17, 1979, having attained the age of 79 years, 6 months, and 20 days.

She had been a long time member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Harlan.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by three brothers - Martin, Herbert, and Chris Jensen; and four sisters - Pena Christensen, Mary Holmes, Annie Jensen in infancy, and Minnie Jensen.

Her survivors include a daughter, Maxine Burlingham of Harlan; a son, Robert Stewart of Glendale, Arizona; 7 grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; nieces and nephews; other relatives and friends.
