Jane Weir, 60

Walnut — Jane Weir was born March 6, 1919 in Griswold, daughter of Dr. Fred Nae and Ina Cardio Hobson. She died Sunday, Dec. 9, 1979 at Jennie Edmundson hospital in Co Bluffs, at age 60 years.

In 1936 she graduated from Griswold high school, where she had been a star basketball player.

She attended Stephens College in Columbia, Mo., for two years, and then was employed by Northwestern Bell and later by Southwestern Bell. On Nov. 27, 1941, she married Dr. Lauren Weir of Griswold. They lived in St. Louis, Mo., Sandpoint, Id., and Maryville, Mo., before moving to Walnut in 1947.

She was a member of the First United Presbyterian church and the First Federated club in Walnut, the P.E.O. Sisterhood in Atlantic.

Survivors include her husband; two daughters, Mrs Michael (Mary) Padgett of Melvindale, Mich., and Mrs Ellkott (Anne) Gordon of Phoenix, Ariz.; four grandchildren, Michael and Kathryn Padgett, Wendy and Aaron Girdon; her mother of the Peace Haven in Walnut; two brothers, Dr. Robert Hobson of Santa Barbara, Calif.; and Fred Hobson of St. George, Utah; nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her father and a sister.

A memorial service was held at the First Presbyterian church in Walnut on Wednesday, Dec. 12, 1979 with Rev. Bruno Romanowski, officiating.
