

Glee White, 66

Glee Owen White, son of Carl and Hazel Goodner White, was born on a farm in Shelby county, on Nov. 14, 1910. He died at Jennie Edmundson Memorial hospital in Co. Bluffs, on May 5, 1977, at age 66 years, 5 months and 21 days. He lived on a farm near Tennant, and attended school in Tennant. In 1925, he moved, with his parents to Tucson, Ariz., where he attended high school. He moved back to Harlan, in 1930 and held various jobs for several years. On Sept. 16, 1939, he married Elva Blair at Forest City. They made their home in Harlan where Glee was employed as a bus driver for the Davis Bus Line. In 1948 he became a salesman for the Moorman Manufacturing Co. and served in this capacity for 23 years before retiring in Dec. of 1972. Glee joined the Tennant Methodist church as a youth and has been a member of the Harlan First United Methodist church for many years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Carl White in 1932 and Hazel White Andersen in 1957. His survivors include his wife, Elva White, of Harlan; a sister, Aldine (Mrs Wallace Inman) of Hastings, Nebr.; two aunts; an uncle, nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Saturday, May 7, 1977 with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Jake More, Galen Plumb, Jack Gaskill, Gaillard Lund, Reese Laughlin, and Howard W. Pedersen serving as casketbearers.
