

**The Life Story of-
MRS JOSEPHINE ZIMMERMAN, 84**

Josephine Zimmerman, daughter of Anna Tepli and Leopold Posch, was born December 27, 1886 at Vienna, Austria. At the age of six she moved to Germany where she grew to womanhood. In 1904 she came to the United States, coming to New Bedford, Mass. This was her home until April of 1910. She then moved to Westphalia and this has been her home since that time. October 25, 1910 she was united in marriage to Emil John Zimmerman at Westphalia and to this union ten children were born. Mrs Zimmerman has been a member of St. Boniface Church of Westphalia since 1910 and she was also a member of the Rosary Society. In June of 1966 she became a resident of the Little Flower Haven in Earling. She died April 9, 1971 in the Myrtue Memorial Hospital at the age of 84 years, 3 months and 12 days.

Mrs Zimmerman was preceded in death by her husband, Emil in April of 1956; a daughter, Marie in Sept. of 1936; one grandson; her parents and seven sisters and brothers.

She is survived by six sons, Roman of Manilla, Bernard of Westphalia, Jack of Earling, Rev. Anthony Zimmerman of Nagoya, Japan, Rev Aloysius Zimmerman of Chicago and Lawrence of New Richmond, Wisc.; three daughters, Betty (Mrs Vern Gaul) of Earling, Ann (Mrs John Gaul, Jr.) of Omaha and Sister Irene Zimmerman of Milwaukee, Wisc.; 30 grandchildren; 5 great-grandchildren; one brother, Brs. Longinus, S.V.D. of Perrysburg, Ohio and one sister, Sister JoAnn Posch of Milwaukee, Wisc.
