OAKLAND - Phyllis Pauline Beedle was born near Oakland Nov. 29, 1920. She was the daughter of D. Earl and Sybil Turner Chaney and was one of three children in the family. She attended school in Oakland and graduated in 1938. She took Normal Training in High School, so following her graduation she taught in country schools in the area for several years.

She married Theodore Beedle Jan. 10, 1943, at Oakland. They farmed in the Oakland, Avoca and Hancock areas. They were the parents of four children, Carol, Ronald, Gary and Jeanne. While the children were growing up she served as a 4-H leader for a number of years. He died March 18, 1991 and in 1992, she moved to the Valley View Apartments in Oakland, where she made her home until August of 1996, when she became a resident of the Colonial Manors Nursing Home in Avoca. She was a member of the Hancock United Methodist Church as well as the Women's Fellowship of the Church. She was also a member of the Oakland Federated Club and had been a member of the Knox Homemakers Club. She died at the Colonial Manors Nursing Home in Avoca Nov. 1, 1996, at age 75 years, 11 months and three days.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Ted; a daughter, Carol, and a brother, Eldon Chaney. She is survived by her children, Ronald Beedle and Gary Beedle both of Hancock, and Jeanne (Charles) Linquist of Underwood; eight grandchildren; five great grandchildren; a sister, Marjorie (Sherwood) Bentley of Macedonia; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Nov. 5, 1996, at the Knutson Funeral Chapel with Rev. Dr. Judy Flanegin officiating. Burial was in the Oaklawn Cemetery. Casket bearers were Bruce Bentley, Perry Beedle, Douglas Beedle, Rod Bentley, Mark Beedle and Rick Beedle.
