HARLAN — Paul Joseph Belliveau, son of Frank and Alvina (La Pante) Belliveau, was born March 30, 1927, at Langdon, N.D. He was baptized, received his First Communion, and was confirmed at the Catholic Church at Milton, N.D., and attended school at Milton. In 1946, he entered the U.S. Navy at San Diego, CA., serving his country during WW II. After his discharge from the Navy in 1949, he was employed in FL., for several years.

March 10, 1956, he married Patricia Mooney at Ottumwa. They were the

parents of three daughters. After their marriage, they lived and worked in various towns in IA. and N.D., and in Aug. of 1990, they moved to Harlan. This has been their home since that time. They had celebrated 35 years of marriage this month. He died March 21, 1991, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, at age 63 years, 11 months and 19 days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, Ray; a sister, Lena; and a grandson, Jason Nelson. Surviving him is his wife, Pat of Harlan; three daughters, Nancy Higdem of Denison; Wanda Belliveau of Grand Forks, N.D., and Dixie Hovater of Colorado Springs, CO.; five grandchildren; one brother, Adlord Belliveau of Sunnyside, WA.; one sister, Geraldine Klobuchter of Flagstaff, AZ., and other relatives.

Funeral services were held March 25, 1991 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Rev. Edward Kelly of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan, officiating.
