

Earl Breining, 76

KIMBALLTON — Earl Breining was born Jan. 28, 1911 in Audubon County, IA. His parents were Thomas and Marie (Winters) Breining. He was baptized in Eberness Lutheran Church in Audubon county. He lived with his parents in the Guthrie Center, Route and Ayrshire communities. He attended the Guthrie Center Schools. He also attended high school in Ayrshire. He married Dagny Rasmussen March 8, 1937. They lived in Kimballton for three years and then moved to a farm just west of

Kimballton where they lived and farmed from 1949 until 1973. They moved to Elk Horn in 1973, where they have made their home for the past fourteen years. They have been members of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kimballton since their marriage. He has been a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church board and has also served a four year term on the Kimballton school board. He died Dec. 4, 1987 in Myrtus Memorial hospital in Harlan at age 76 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, Lorenis (age 24) and one infant grandson, Christopher Ronald Breinig. He is survived by his wife, Dagny of Elk Horn, one son, Ron Breining of Kimballton; two daughters, Muriel (Mrs Pete) Petersen of Kimballton and Diane (Mrs Jim) Juelsgaard of Elk Horn; 15 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. Also surviving are two brothers, Adolph Breining of Elk Horn and Robert Breining of Port Angeles, WA.
