Harlan - Lenora Frances Buch, daughter of John and Elizabeth (Schmitt) Buch, was born Oct. 30, 1918 at Harlan. She attended Lincoln Township No. 1 School and then Harlan High School. She became very involved with her church and spiritual

life. She traveled around the world visiting Lourdes, Fatima, Guadeloupe, Rue-de-Bac, home of the Miraculous Medal, Garabandal, Pontamain, Beaurang, LaSalette, Medugorge, and recently, Betania, Venezuela and Akita, Japan as well as several World Eucharistic Congresses. She was employed just under twenty years at the Baptist Memorial Home in the house-keeping department and was due to work Thanksgiving Day, the day she died. She died at her home Nov. 23, 1995 at age 77 and 24 days. She was a member of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan and the Catholic Daughters of America, Court St. Katherine #266 of Earling.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by a brother, Nicholas Buch in 1975 and a baby sister, Elizabeth, in infancy. She is survived by her cousins.
