IRWIN - Marvin 'Padre' Bruce Barratt, son of Bruce B. and Sarah Magdaline (Sorensen) Barratt, was born April 11, 1915, on the family farm in rural lowin, Shelby County. He was the oldest of four boys, and helped out on the family farm. After graduation from the Irwin High School, he had hoped to become a civil engineer, but his father's death prevented him from attending college. He farmed instead.

Feb. 27, 1947, he married Norma Brue in Irwin. The couple became the parents of five sons, and after Norma's death May 28, 1967, he continued raising his sons. One of Marvin's proudest moments was receiving a special award from Dana College for having five sons attend the school; this prompted him to establish a scholarship trust. He died June 19, 1998, at the Manilla Manor at age 83 years, two months and eight days.

Preceding him in death were his parents; one brother, Vernon Barratt; his first wife, Norma (Brue) Barratt; and his second wife, Ruby (Hanson) Barratt. Survivors include five sons, Steven M. Barratt of Kirkman; Roger L. (Angie) Barratt of Oakland and Kevin K. Barratt, Brian B. Barratt and Joel G. Barratt, all of Omaha; four grandchildren, Kyle, Ryan, Jordan and Shelby; two brothers, Robert (Mary) Barratt of Pleasant Hills and Duane (Bernice) Barratt of Irwin: and other relatives.
