

Maxine V. Boardman, 80

June 26, 1916 - May 9, 1997

HARLAN - Maxine Virginia Boardman, daughter of George and Pearl (Dustin) Heilig, was born June 26, 1916 at Harlan. She attended country school in Shelby County and graduated from the Harlan High School where she received her normal training for teaching. She taught school in Rabbit Hollow after graduation.

July 22, 1933, she married John David Boardman at Rockport, MO. To this union two children were born. After their marriage, they farmed near Tennant, until they retired and moved to Harlan in 1974. She was a past member of the United Methodist Church in Tennant, and a member of the First United Methodist Church in Harlan. She was active in church circles and also was a member of the Zenobia Rebekah Lodge No. 286 in Harlan. After the death of her husband in 1983, she continued to make her home in Harlan until March of 1997, when she became a resident of Little Flower Haven in Earling. It was there that she died May 9, 1997, at age 80 years, 10 months and 13 days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, David, and her brother, William Heilig. She is survived by her children, James Boardman (Crystal) of Portsmouth and Sally Dixon (Robert) of Correctionville; her mother, Pearl Dustin of El Dorado, CA; her sisters, Genevieve Stirnamen of El Dorado, CA and Audrey Hein (Lyle) of Omaha; and her half-sister, Nella-Mae Burch (Hal) of Carlsborg, WA; six grandchildren; six great grandchildren and other relatives.

Funeral services were held May 12, 1997, at Pauley Funeral Home with Rev. Paul Wilcox of First United Methodist Church in Harlan officiating. Burial was in the Shelby Cemetery with Ted Heilig, Wayne Boardman, David Dixon, Mark Boardman, Tim L. Heilig and Steve Boardman casket bearers.
