She attended school at Elk Horn and was a member of the graduating class of 1947. Upon graduation from high school, she went to lowa State Teacher's College at Cedar Falls, and obtained her Bachelor's degree in 1951. She then taught high school for a short time before moving to Washington, D.C. where she was a Congressional Secretary. La Deane returned to low where she attended graduate school at low State University in Ames.
