HARLAN — Grace Helen Carson, daughter of John and Anna (Mickelson) Frederickson was born Aug. 13, 1900, at Harlan. She attended school in Harlan, graduating in 1917. She then attended Van Sants Business College in Omaha, NE., for one year. After college, she worked at the Shelby County State Bank as a clerk for three years.

Jan. 8, 1921, she married Earl Carson at the Congregational Church in Sioux City. They were the parents of one daughter, Patricia. After their marriage, Mr Carson was employed by the State of Iowa as a Civil Engineer, and they lived in several Iowa communities. For a short time, they lived in St. Charles, MO., before moving to Rock Rapids, where Mr Carson worked as the Lyon County Engineer. After the death of her husband in June of 1969, she continued to reside in Rock Rapids until 1972 when she moved to Harlan. In Oct. of 1990, she became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan, and this has been her home since that time. She was an active member of the Congregational United Church of Christ in Harlan and the Priscilla Society of the church. she also was active in the PEO organization, the Eastern Star; and the Women's Club of Harlan. She died April 4, 1992, at the Baptist Memorial Home at age 91 years, seven months and 22 days.

In addition to her parents and husband Earl, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Louis, Donald, and a sister, Frances. Surviving is her daughter, Patricia (Gene) Rosburg of Davenport; four grandchildren; and one great-grandchild; one sister, Mildred* Bud* Almgren of Bloomfield, CO., and other relatives.

Funeral services were held April 7, 1992 at Pauley Funeral Home with Rev. Randall Teeuwen of the Congregational United Church of Christ in Harlan, officiating.
