CO. BLUFFS — Lyle E. Chambers, son of William J. and Matilda A. (McGinnell) Chambers was born Feb. 19, 1931, in Jackson (Iowa), Shelby county. He attended country school at Jackson No. 3 and graduated from the Harlan High School with the class of 1948. He worked for a time at the Harlan Newspaper office and in Minnesota for a while and then he entered the U.S. Marine Corp during the Korean conflict. After his honorable discharge, he returned to Co. Bluffs and worked as a truck driver for the All American Transport Co., in Omaha for 26 years.

May 27, 1954, he married Mary Murphy and they were privileged to celebrate their 38th wedding anniversary. He was a member of the Faith Lutheran Church in Co. Bluffs and held a number of offices through the years. He died April 30, 1993 at the Underwood Care Center in Omaha, NE., after a lengthy illness, at age 62 years, 2 months and 11 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents and 2 grandchildren. He is survived by his wife, Mary; 3 daughters, Kathy Murphy of Co. Bluffs; Sheila Theophilopoulos and Debbie Burse of Omaha, NE.; 4 sons, Mike Murphy, Steve and Jeff Chambers of Co. Bluffs; and Lynn Chambers of Weatherford, TX.; 22 grandchildren; 1 sister, Docia Linde of Harlan; and 1 brother, George Chambers of Kirkman; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held May 3, 1993 at Faith Lutheran Church with Rev. Richard Elke, officiating. Casketbearers were Don Kaderlik, Henry Petersen, Robert Atkins, Sr., Chris Mohr, Dick Lippert and Roy Duesing. Military rites were conducted by the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 737 with burial at the Memorial Park cemetery in Co. Bluffs.
