

Adda Beulah Clark, 91

Oct. 13, 1901 — April 13, 1993

IRWIN — Adda Beulah, daughter of Joseph L. and Maggie Gardner Olson, was born Oct. 13, 1901 near Red Line. She grew up in the Manilla area where she attended rural school at Jefferson #3 through the 8th grade. She then attended Irwin High School, graduating in 1918. That summer she took Normal Training in Carroll and taught school at Jefferson #3 for three years.

March 3, 1923, she married Homer Clark. Three children, Lorren, Howard, and Jean were born to this union. The family lived on a farm north-east of Irwin for 34 years. In 1962 they moved to Irwin. Homer died in 1974. She was a member of the United Methodist Church in Irwin and the United Methodist Women. She also held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary and was a charter member of the Jefferson Community Club.

Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents and 3 brothers, Bert, Roy and Clifford. Survivors include her 3 children, Joseph Lorren Clark of Co. Bluffs; Howard Dean Clark (Marianne) of Manilla; and Jean Lorea (Gerald) Lansman of Atlantic; 7 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren; 1 brother, Clyde Olson of CA.; 2 sisters-in-law, Thelma Olson of Irwin and Ruth Olson of Loveland, CO.; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held April 16, 1993 at the United Methodist Church in Irwin with Rev. Walter Bernard, officiating. Burial was in the Oak Hill cemetery in Irwin.
