

## **Delores Conrad, 69**

**Nov. 22, 1921 — Oct. 17, 1991**

**HARLAN** — Delores Louree Conrad, daughter of Charles and Bertha (Luckinbill) Bristol was born Nov. 22, 1921, on a farm near Kirkman. She died Oct. 17, 1991, at the Jennie Edmundson Hospital in Co. Bluffs, at age 69 years, 10 months and 25 days. She attended Polk Twp. #5 country school, and graduated from Harlan High School in 1939. After receiving her Normal Training, she became a teacher and taught for a short time in the country school system.

Sept. 14, 1940, she married Alvin Conrad at the Methodist Church in Harlan. Five children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in Lincoln twp. They retired from farming in 1982, but continued to reside on the farm. They were privileged to have celebrated 51 years of marriage just last month. In addition to being a member of the Harlan Church of Christ, she was active in the Myrtue Memorial Hospital Auxiliary and the Lincoln Social Club. She had been a 4-H leader; was active in the Rebekah Lodge for several years, the Lincoln Twp. Community Chest, and the Shelby County Extension. Her activities in the home also included sewing, needlework, quilting, and knitting.
