AVOCA - Donald Lee Cue was born in Atlantic on Jan. 20, 1930. He was the son of Harlie and Esther Nelsen Cue. He was one of four children in the family. He attended school in Atlantic and graduated with the class of 1949. He married Lois Betts Nov. 23, 1952 at Casey. They were the parents of four children. He worked most of his life as a meat cutter. He worked for a number of years for the Safeway Stores. They lived in Atlantic and Creston and also Jackson, MN. From 1963 until 1969 he worked for the Super Value Store in Atlantic. In 1969, they moved to Avoca to make their home. He worked in the Avoca area as a meat cutter and also helping Lois in the flower shop, until he was diagnosed as having cancer in 1988. He served in the Iowa National Guard in Atlantic for 13 years. He was a member of the United Church of Avoca, having served as both an Elder and a Deacon of the church as well as being a Stephens Minister. He was also a member and

a Past President of the Avoca Rotary Club. He was a past member of the Elks Lodge in Atlantic and the Avoca Lions Club. He died at Jennie Edmundson Hospital in Co. Bluffs March 26, 1990 at age 60 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents; one grandson, Benjamin Sorenson and one brother, Leland Cue. Survivors include his wife, Lois; their children, Terry Cue of Avoca; Debbie Sorenson of Atlantic; Candice (Greg) Brown of Dunlap; Alan Cue of Winnebago, MN; ten grandchildren; two sister, Beulah (Ron) Ostrus and Leila (Kenneth) Christensen both living near Wota; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Services were held March 29, 1990 at United Church of Avoca with Dr. Robert Houser, officiating. Casketbearers were Roger Armburg, Gary Armburg, Raymond Ostrus, Doug Ostrus, Dave Christensen, Dannie Christensen, Dale Christensen and Bill O'Connell. Burial was in Graceland cemetery in Avoca.
