

Ethel Campbell, 85

Feb. 23, 1919 - June 5, 2004

HARLAN – Ethel Leona Jensen Campbell, the daughter of Louis and Millie Paulsen Jensen, was born Feb. 23, 1919, in Harlan. Ethel attended school in Harlan and graduated from the Harlan High School May 26, 1938.

Ethel married William "Bill" Campbell Sept. 19, 1938, at a Presbyterian Church in Maryville, MO. They were the parents of one son, William Jr. Ethel worked as a bookkeeper at Merrill Canning Company for many years. In 1963, Ethel and Bill bought the Brickyard Orchard. Bill and Ethel created a legend by serving Shelby County "Brickyard Apple Cider". When Ethel's health began to fail she moved to Little Flower Haven. She died June 5, 2004, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 85 years, three months and 10 days.

In addition to her parents, Ethel is preceded in death by her husband, William, who died Jan. 16, 2000, and her sister, Helen Obrecht.
