

# Harlan man hit by car, killed

**HARLAN** -- A 90-year-old Harlan man was struck by a car and killed as he was walking across 12th St. from Myrtue Memorial Hospital to the Baptist Memorial Home Monday afternoon, Nov. 10.

Maurice R. Campbell was pronounced dead at Myrtue Hospital shortly after the mishap, which occurred at about 4 p.m. Monday.

Harlan Police reports indicated Campbell was apparently walking from the hospital back to the Baptist Home that afternoon. He was walking on the street portion of Garfield Ave. and then walked into the intersection of 12th St., reports said.

He was struck by a southbound 1990 Pontiac Grand Am driven by Daniel V. Ferry, 16, Harlan, at the intersection. Campbell hit the windshield of the vehicle and then was thrown about 15 feet, landing on the pavement, officials said.

Medivac Ambulance/Rescue, the Harlan Police Department and Shelby County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene. Campbell was transported to

the hospital after receiving treatment at the accident scene.

Harlan police said no charges will be filed as a result of the accident. There was limited damage to the Ferry vehicle, and Ferry was not injured.

## Funeral services

Services for Campbell were held Thursday, Nov. 13 at 10:30 a.m. at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Irwin with burial in the Oak Hill Cemetery, Irwin.

He is survived by his daughter, Marjorie (Robert) Ahrenholtz of Harlan; two brothers -- Ralph (Irene) Campbell of Irwin and Floyd Campbell of Defiance; one sister, Arlene Campbell, of Defiance; three grandchildren -- Alan (Jody) Ahrenholtz of Woodbine, Dale Ahrenholtz of Santa Fe, N.M. and Leann (Roger) Saylor of Treynor; and six great-grandchildren.
