Dallas Dent, 85

REDLINE – Dallas Raymond Dent, the son of Raymond and Lola (Snyder) Dent was born Jan. 15, 1905, at Lenora, OK. At the age of nine months, he traveled with his family by covered wagon to Redline and later attended Polk # 5 country school.

Jan. 22, 1927, he married Elma Petersen at the Lutheran Parsonage in Jacksonville. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Redline until 1954, when he retired from farming and they moved into Harlan. He began carpentry work, which he continued until two years ago. They were privileged to have celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary in Jan. of this year. He died June 27, 1990 at his home in Harlan, at age 85 years, five months and 12 days. He was a member of the Church of Christ in Redline.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by an infant daughter, Colleen; and two sisters, Fern and Ruby. Surviving him in addition to his wife, Elma of Harlan, is a son, Darrell of Co. Bluffs; a daughter, Beverly (Ed) Tolle of Kirkman; four grandchildren; four step-grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; five step-great-grandchildren; one sister, Iris (Raymond) Strong of Avoca; a sister-in-law, Grace Petersen of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held June 30, 1990 at Pauley Funeral Home with Roy North of the Redline Church of Christ officiating. Burial was in the Redline cemetery with Art Linde, Lynn Dent, Ralph Dent, Eugene Gaer, Phil Daringer, and Clifford Kauffman serving as casketbearers.
