AVOCA — Genevieve Selma Jacobsen Doll was born in Story County, March 3, 1909. She was the daughter of George and Lena Jorgenson Jacobson. She was one of three children in the family. She graduated from the Gilbert Consolidated High School in Gilbert, and the American Institute of Banking in Des Moines, as a business graduate.

She began her duties as bookkeeper at the Citizens Savings Bank in Avoca in Sept. of 1927. During her association with the bank, she served as cashier and vice president. She was a member of the Board of Directors, serving under four bank presidents. During this time she also served as farm agent, executor, administrator, conservator, guardian and trustee. She completed 50 years of service to the bank in 1977 and retired in Jan. of 1980. She was a 50 year member of the Iowa Bankers Association, a member of the United Church of Avoca, Avoca Federated Garden Club, P.E.O., Knox Project Club, Questers, Avoca Business Women, Avoca Housing Association, Avoca Golf Association, Treasurer of the Avoca Historical Society and other clubs. She was honored as Grand Marshal of Avoca's 4th of July Parade in 1983.

She married Edwin Doll Oct. 9, 1988 t the United Church in Avoca. Edwin died Oct. 12, 1992. She died at her residence Aug. 11, 1993, following a brief illness at age 84 years, 5 months and 8 days.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Edwin; a stepson; a niece and a great-niece. Survivors are her brother, Lawrence Jacobson (Vera) of Story City; a sister, Pauline (Fred) Crandall of Burwell, NE.; five nieces; six nephews; 12 great-nieces and nephews; 1 great great nephew; a step-daughter, Carol (Don) Cameron of Mountain View, CA.; a step-daughter-in-law, Ellen Doll of Osage; 6 step-grandchildren; and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Aug. 16, 1993, at the United Church of Avoca with Rev. Gerald Kuyk, officiating. Burial was in the Graceland cemetery in Avoca.
