DEFIANCE – Raymond Rudolph Domino, son of Mathew and Barbara (Engel) Domino, was born Jan. 28, 1913 on a farm in Shelby County. He died at his home in Defiance, Nov. 17, 1988 at age 75 years, 9 months and 19 days. He was baptized, received his First Communion and confirmed in the Catholic faith.

He married Irene Langenfeld at Westphalia. Four daughters were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in the Westphalia-Defiance area and he also worked as a carpenter. After the death of Irene in Feb. of 1952, he continued to reside near Defiance until a short time ago when he retired and moved into Defiance. He was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Defiance.

In addition to his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by a sister, Marie Newcomb. He is survived by his daughters, Karen A. Kramolisch, Omaha, NE; Maxine Schwarte, Co. Bluffs; Carol Lee Bruce, Red Oak; and Margie Schaben of Defiance; 12 grandchildren; a half-brother, Peter Domino of Harlan; two brothers, Michael of Norwalk and Leo of Des Moines; and two sisters, Margaret (Mrs Gerald) Wilwerding of Sierra Madre, CA and Josephine (Mrs Linus) Langenfeld of Dow City.

A Mass of Christian burial was celebrated Nov. 19, 1988 at St. Peter's Catholic Church, Defiance with Rev. Nelo Leto as the celebrant.
