In addition to being a member of the American Legion, Post # 707 in Defiance, he also served as its finance office for many years. He coached boys' basketball for St. Paul's Catholic School for several years.

In addition to his parents and his first wife, Cecelia; he was preceded in death by an infant son; a step-daughter, Barbara Ohlinger; three sisters, Margaret Koppold, Lena Schleier, and an infant Katie; and two brothers, Adolph and an infant Pete.

Surviving him in addition to his wife, Bernice of Harlan, are four sons, Dennis Dotzler of Omaha, Ne.; Frederick Dotzler of Saratoga, CA.; William Dotzler of San Mateo, CA., and Bruce Dotzler of Liberty, MO.; 3 daughters, Sandra (Jerry) Heller of Defiance; Mary (Mike) Rohe of Manning; Betty (Joe) Keane of Deliance; 13 grandchildren; two sisters, Barbara (Mrs Frank) Koppold and Irene (Mrs Jake) Erlbacher, both of Harlan; two brothers, Joseph of Deliance and Felix of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.
