She was a longtime church school teacher, a member and officer of United Methodist Women, church historian, pianist and United Methodist Builders member. She was an especially gifted writer. She kept a daily diary and in addition wrote in her journal her thoughts, favorite scripture and prayers, her beliefs, memories and commentaries. She shared her gift of writing and her wisdom in countless notes to so many. Bernita died November 27, 2008 while in hospice care at Salem Nursing Home in Elk Horn, IA, having attained the age of eighty-eight years, nine months and one day.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband Dale Doonan, son Jay Doonan, sister Lorna Kinney and brother Roger Parker.
