## Stanley R. Eckel, 80

In the fall of 1947, they moved to the Eckel home place west of Shelby where they were engaged in farming. They continued to farm there until 1975 when he retired from farming and they moved into their home in Shelby. This has been their home since that time.

He was an active member of the Presbyterian church in Shelby. He has been ordaried as an Elder in the Church and also held several offices in the Mariners organization of the church. He remained active in the church until the time of his illness. He had served as an officer of the Pottawattamic County Farm Bureau and had worked part time in several of the businesses in Shelby since he retired from farming.

He died on Easter Sunday, April 19, 1987 after a long illness, at age 80 years, 11

months and 17 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents; one brother, Thornton and one sister, Florence Walters. He is survived by his wife, Dorothy of Shelby; his son, Lynn of Glenwood; his daughter, Diane (Mrs Ben) Voss of Omaha; two granddaughters; two brothers, Clyde of Herman, NE. and Dwight of Shelby; two sisters, Edna (Mrs Jesse) Pike of Shelby and Helen (Mrs Clarence) McKnabb of Shelby; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
