

Anna Frances Feser, 97

June 28, 1893 — April 10, 1991

HARLAN — Anna Frances Feser, daughter of Henry and Susan (Reinig) Greiner, was born June 28, 1893, at Portsmouth. She died at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, April 10, 1991, at age 97 years, 9 months and 13 days. She was baptized, received her First Communion, and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Portsmouth.

Nov. 28, 1916, she married William Feser at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Portsmouth. Seven children were born to this union. After their marriage, they lived on a farm near Defiance. Later they moved to Fleming, CO., where they lived for three years. They then moved to the Portsmouth vicinity, where they farmed until he died May 27, 1952, due to injuries suffered from an auto accident. After his death, she made her home in Omaha, NE., for 30 years, and move to Harlan in 1986. She became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home on May 24, 1990. This has been her home since that time. She was a member of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan.

In addition to her parents and husband; she was preceded in death by two sisters, Angela Schwartz and Mary Kelliher; three brothers, Nicolas, Fred and Matt Greiner; a son-in-law Alfred Ohlinger and two grandchildren, Mary Lee Ohlinger and Michael Gangestad.
