Later he became employed at Dubuque Pack in Denison for several years, but continued to barber until three weeks ago. He died April 26, 1994 at the Crawford County Memorial Hospital in Denison at age 72 years, three months and two days. He was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Defiance and the Defiance American Legion, Post #707.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Kenneth and Charles Feser. He is survived by his sisters and brothers-Grace (Ed) Tremel of Woodbine, James Feser of Defiance, John "Jack" Feser of Clarinda, Betty (Otis) Frazier of Dunlap, Arlene (Gary) Michel of Woodbine, Ruth (Leo) Gross of Earling, Maxine (Bernard) Klein of Audubon, Marie Panchot of St. Louis, MO, Virginia (Clarence) Goeres of Defiance and Velma (Lawrence) Fuhrmann of Livermore, nieces and nephews and other rela-
