EARLING – Albert Joseph Foxhoven, son of William and Anna (Engel) Foxhoven was born Dec. 16, 1909, on a farm near Earling. He was baptized, received his First Communion, and was confirmed at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Earling, and attended St. Joseph's School. As a young man, he helped his parents on the family farm. Later he drove his own truck, and began trucking for area farmers.

This was their home until Jan. of 1991, when they became residents of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan. It was there that he died June 30, 1991, at age 81 years, six months and 14 days. He was a lifetime member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, and was a member of the Holy Name Society.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by four sisters, Isabelle, Cecelia, Rose, and Catherine, and four brothers, William, Alfred and twins, Peter and Paul. Surviving him are two sisters, Kunigunda Fuhs of the Little Flower Haven in Earling, and Tillie (Mrs John) Healey of Oxnard, CA.; four brothers, Ted of Harlan; Henry of Earling; Ralph of Harlan, and Bernard of Shenandoah; nieces and nephews, and other relatives.
