Funeral services were held Oct. 11, 1988 at Pauley Funeral Home with Pastor George Spencer of Merrill's Grove Baptist Church officiating. Burial was in Cuppy's Grove cemetery, Shelby County with Bob Welk, Howard Gaer, Robert McCord, Clarence Larson and Kenard Christensen serving as honorary casket bearers.
