

## **Linda Ann (Christiansen) Frazer, 73**

**March 18, 1937 - Oct. 20, 2010**

**GREEN VALLEY, AZ** — Linda Ann Frazer (Christiansen) passed away on October 20, 2010, at La Posada in Green Valley, AZ.

Linda was born on a farm near Harlan to Lynden and LouVern (Weimer) Christiansen. She spent the next 19 years in Iowa before moving to Denver, CO where she worked several months for Lou Bell Lincoln and Mercury Motors before being employed as a P.B.X. operator, donor intake clerk at Belle Bonfils Memorial Blood Bank.

While living in Denver she met and married Dallas McKee Frazer where their two daughters were born. Mr. Frazer's work took the family to Portland, OR and eventually to Yakima, WA, where they resided for 29 years. During this time, Linda was president of the League of Women Voters of Yakima County and a longtime member of Chinook Toastmasters. At the age of 50 Linda entered Yakima Junior College with the goal of learning more about computers. This led to receiving her A.A. and becoming employed for 10 years in the G.E.D. and E.S.L. programs housed on campus. At the time of her retirement, she helped students and their instructors with lessons in a room of 30 computers. In March of 2003, the Frazers purchased a condo in Green Valley, AZ and for a few years traveled in the summers to a second home located in Enumclaw, WA, where their oldest daughter and family lived. In March of 2007, the decision was made to close both residences and move permanently to La Posada. During the years there life was enjoyed with classes, volunteering at the Los Niño's Del Valle Preschool and the Adult Day Care Programs, and attending the many activities that are offered at the La Posada campus. It was while living at La Posada, that she renewed her interest in learning to swim and in her early 70's set that as a goal. Linda was a member of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Green Valley and had served on its caring and hospitality committees.

Linda is survived by her husband of 50 years; two daughters and their husbands, Janelle L. Frazer (Robert R. Matson) and Michelle L. Frazer (Terry Morrow; honorary granddaughter, Joy E. Langley; grandchildren, Sean R. Matson and Emily L. Matson. She is also survived by her sister and brother-in-law, Jane and Jerry Summers; brother, John and his wife, Vy Christiansen; and sister-in-law, Pat Kleinpaste (Dan).

Memorial services will be held at La Posada on November 3, 2010, at 2:00 p.m. in the El Dorado Room at La Perla.
