

George T. Gillette, 72

CEDAR FALLS – George T. Gillette, 72, of the American Health Care Center and formerly of 1227 Parker, Cedar Falls, died May 23, 1990 at Allen Memorial Hospital, following a lengthy illness.

He was born May 7, 1918 in Harlan, the son of George T. and Mae Petersen Gillette. He married Lois J. Yates Feb. 13, 1937 in San Jose, CA., and she died Oct. 28, 1988.
