## Paula "Pauline" Graham, 95

Avoca - Paula Dorothea Anna Graham was born near Silver City Sept. 25, 1898, daughter of Hinrich and Marie Rohlfs Hartje. Pauline, as she was called by many of her friends was one of two children in the family. Her mother died when she was 8 years old.
