

Woodrow W. Hansen, 71

WALNUT - Woodrow W. Hansen was born at Brayton, Nov. 20, 1918 to Kasper and Martha Larsen Hansen. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. He attended rural school in Audubon Co. He entered the service on June 12, 1942 and was discharged on Oct. 30, 1945. He served with the 18th Fighter Control Squadron stationed in Hawaii.

Feb. 3, 1952 he married Wilma Winter at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Audubon. He farmed all of his life and many of these years were spent on a farm south of Walnut. He retired from farming in 1984. He died July 29, 1990 at Clarkson Hospital in Omaha at age 71 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Ernest, who died in infancy. Surviving him are his wife, Wilma; two sons, Robert Hansen (Sue) of Atlantic and Karl Hansen of Walnut; one granddaughter; one brother, Arnold Hansen of Atlantic; two sisters, Mrs Arthur (Irma) Bro of Exira and Mrs Don (Fern) Nelson of Atlantic; nieces, nephews and relatives.

Services were held at Peace United Church of Christ in Walnut on Aug. 1, 1990 with Darrell Sunderman, Dennis Whyte, Robert Richter, Kenneth Blum, Maurice Croghan, and Douglas Lay as honorary casketbearers.
