## Gaillard Ray Heflin, 85

Harlan - Gaillard Ray Heflin, son of Luke and Mary Hulda (Obrecht) Heflin, was born in Center Township, Shelby County Dec. 5, 1908. He attended school at Windy Knoll School, a Center Township Country School, and graduated from Harlan
