Harlan - Dec. 19, 1909, Anna Pauline Wetzel was born to Oswald Henry and Anna (Eigler) Wetzel. She was born and raised on a farm south of Manilla. She was the youngest of thirteen children. After completing eighth grade, she stayed home to care for her mother who was not well.

Feb. 6, 1929, she married John Hemminger in Denison at the Presbyterian Parsonage. In 1930, Anna Marie was born. They lived three years on her Dad's home place near Manilla and in the Spring

of 1932, purchased a farm near Harlan. In 1933, Ronald Delane was born. In 1939, Charlene Rose was born. In 1942 John was born. She was a member and active in the First United Methodist Church, the Farm Bureau, community affairs, the Republican party, a member of the Zenobia Rebekah Lodge #286 as well as several card and social clubs and an Avon representative for 34 years. She died June 2, 1994 at the Methodist Hospital in Omaha at age 84 years, 5 months and 14 days.
