MONTEZUMA — Frederick Harry Hubbard, 79, of Montezuma, died Aug. 28, 1991 at Rose Haven Nursing Home at Margengo of complications of Alzheimer's Disease. He was born Aug. 29, 1911 at Montezuma, the son of Arthur and Ella McKeag Hubbard. He attended school in Montezuma.

Feb. 1, 1934, he married Katherine Schilder at Grinnell. They helped her parents on the farm until he found employment in Montezuma, working for several area service stations, prior to becoming a meat cutter for the Monte Locker. Later he was employed by several area grocery stores, Brownell's and Sig Manufacturing Co. They operated the Malcom Locker before building their own business, Hubbard Freezer Service, in Montezuma.

He was proud to have served for 25 years on the Montezuma Volunteer Fire Dept. He was a long time member of Midway Grange No. 2189, Knights of Pythias Aztec Lodge and Odd Fellows Lodge. He was also a member of the First Christian Church of Montezuma.
