Elmore, MN - Harvey Harold Hulsebus was born Nov. 9, 1926, in Defiance, the son of Ben and Martha (Quathammer) Hulsebus. He graduated from Defiance High School in 1944. He received a BA degree from Westmar College in LeMars in 1950. He earned a Master of Arts degree in Industrial Arts in 1957 from Colorado State College in Greeley, CO.

He married Betty Kay Hacklander June 9, 1951, in Blue Earth, MN. He served two years in the U.S. Navy during WWII as a radar operator. He taught three years in Schleswig, and 35 years in Elmore, MN as instructor in Jr. High and High School Industrial Arts, Sciences, Physical Education and

coached all Jr. High sports. He retired in 1988. He received the 1969 State of Minnesota Teacher of Excellence Award. He was a member of the Blue Earth Masonic Lodge #57, Ruth Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star, the Gideons, American Legion Post of Elmore and an active member of Salem United Methodist Church. He died March 5, 1995 in Bonita Springs, FL.

He is survived by his wife: Betty Kay of Elmore; one son: Larry (Lori) of St. Louis Park; two daughters: Cynthia (Mark) Northwick of St. Paul; Sharlene (Todd) Stindtman of Blue Earth; two sisters: Norma Bechtel of Citrus Heights, CA; Geri (Douglas) Hamilton of Amador City, CA; and seven grandchildren.

Services were held March 11, 1995, at Salem United Methodist Church in Blue Earth. Pastor Lyle Krumrie officiated. Burial was in Riverside cemetery in Blue Earth.
