

Harvey J. Hemminger, 71

March 2, 1928 - Feb. 11, 2000

HARLAN – Harvey J. Hemminger was born March 2, 1928, on a farm near Manilla to Pearl and Francis Hemminger. He attended country school near Manning and high school in Manning. He moved to Harlan when he was 18. He was a Korean veteran. He drove truck for many years and was a lineman for the R.E.C. and was a self employed plumber and electrician. He worked for the Mile High Pipeline in Littleton, CO. He also worked at Elm Crest Retirement Community in Harlan, and started the Share Program 4 years ago for Harlan. He was active in the American Legion Helmer Post #150 of Harlan and the Shelby Co. Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #941. He died Feb. 11, 2000, in Co. Bluffs from a heart attack at age 71.



He was preceded in death by his parents and his first wife, Shirley.
