MANILLA – Jeanine Marie, daughter of Gene and Ramona (Kimmen) Case, was born Sept. 26, 1954, in Manning. She attended Manning schools and graduated from high school in 1973.

Dec. 1, 1973, she married Daniel Hinners at Sacred Heart Church in Manning. Two children were born to this union. In 1978, she started working for Avon as one of the youngest district managers. In 1983 Jeanne and Dan started a women's clothing store in Harlan. After five years they expanded to Carroll where, after a couple of years, they changed to a bridal shop. Jeanne was a talented interior decorator and also decorated for weddings during the time they had the bridal shop. In 1996 Jeanne started working for DeVry Technical Institute as a district college recruiter. Then three years later she began working for the Airline Academy of Daytona Beach, FL. Jeanne died on injuries resulting from an automobile accident in Omaha Aug. 2, 2001, at age 46 years, 10 months and seven days.
