DEFIANCE — Clarence Ingram, son of Harry and Elizabeth (Clayton) Ingram was born Dec. 27, 1913, at Lewis. He died Nov. 4, 1992, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, at age 78 years, 10 months and eight days. He attended grade school at Defiance and grew to adulthood on his parents farm.

Dec. 30, 1993, he married Evelyn Farley at the United Methodist Church parsonage in Defiance. After their marriage, they lived in Defiance until 1936, when they moved to Tipton, where he farmed for two years. In 1938, they moved back to Defiance where he worked for Tony Schaben until 1945, and then he became employed by Russ Gould in the produce business in Defiance. In 1958, he bought the business which he owned and operated until 1968 when he sold the business and moved to Harlan for a short time before moving back to Defiance. He was then employed by the Shelby County on bridge crew until he retired in 1978. After the death of Evelyn Aug. 10, 1989, he has continued to make his home in Defiance. He was a member of the Defiance United Methodist Church.

In addition to his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by three brothers, Clayton, Robert, and James Ingram, and sister, Elizabeth Blum. He is survived by two sisters, Helen Petersen and Marge Schraiter both of Millard, NE.; and a brother, Don (Vera) Ingram of Papillion, NE.; three sisters-in-law, Lenora Ingram of Defiance; Leona Ingram of Omaha, NE.; and Kathleen Ingram of Gretna, NE.; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Nov. 6, 1992 at the United Methodist Church in Defiance with Rev. Walter Bernard, officiating. Burial was in the Union twp. cemetery in Defiance.
