

Anna Dorothea Jacobsen, 88

May 22, 1904 — Dec. 15, 1992

KIMBALLTON — Anna Dorothea Jacobsen was born in Audubon county, May 22, 1904. Her parents were Mads and Marie (Beck) Wolters. She was one of seven children. She was baptized here at the Immanuel Lutheran Church, and confirmed at the Poplar Lutheran Church. She attended country grade schools in Audubon county.

She was married at a Lutheran Church in Omaha, NE., to Viggo A. Jacobsen, March 27, 1929. Prior to her marriage, she was a live-in homemaker in various homes in Omaha. She was active in L.C.W. Literary Club, and quilting for Lutheran World Relief. The first 13 years of married life were spent in the Dannebrog, NE. area. A child was born, Doris Marie to this union. They moved back to Kimballton to run the hotel. And then they moved to a farm north of Kimballton, near the Mt. Zion School. In 1961, they moved back to Kimballton to retire. In May of 1971, Viggo died. And in the spring of 1975 she moved to the Fiveplex apartments, where she lived until she had a stroke in Oct. of 1991. In Dec. of 1991 she moved to the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home, where she lived until she died Dec. 15, 1992 — at age 88 years, 6 months and 23 days.

In addition to her husband she was preceded in death by her parents; a brother, Henry; and a sister-in-law, Selma Walters. She is survived by one daughter, Doris (Harvey) Greve; four grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; sisters and brothers, Meta and Louis Brown of Humboldt, NE.; Harry Walters of Elk Horn; Folmer and Francis Walters of Audubon; Gladys and Edvald Jorgensen of Anita; Verner and Nina Walters of Anita; a sister-in-law, Flay Walters of Audubon; many nieces and nephews; and many other relatives.

Funeral services were held Dec. 18, 1992, in the Immanuel Lutheran Church, Kimballton, with Pastor John Riggie, officiating and Pastor Stephen Gronseth, assisting.
