Oct. 21, 1906 — Nov. 11, 1992

HARLAN — Elvie Floe (Fiscus) Kolb, daughter of Paaren and Anna (Mitten) Fiscus, was born Oct. 21, 1906, in Polk twp., Shelby County. She was the oldest of 10 children. She was educated at Polk Twp. #9 school. As a young lady, she worked for various families in the Audubon and Shelby County area. At a young age, she was baptized at the Church of Christ in Redline, and later transferred her membership to the First United Methodist Church of Harlan.

Aug. 26, 1937, she married Lewis Kolb at her grandparents, Albert Mittens in Harlan. To this union two children were born. After their marriage they farmed in Clay twp., until they retired and moved to Harlan in the fall of 1969. Due to failing health, she moved to the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn in Sept., 1985. She died Nov. 11, 1992 at Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, at age 86 years and 21 days.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Lewis in Jan., 1990; and three brothers, Malveree (at birth), Elmer, and Iliff.
