Alfred W. Kahl, 92, died of complications of influenza Monday at Manor of Lely Palms in Naples, FL. Graveside services were held Tuesday at the Oak Hill Cemetery in Irwin.

Mr. Kahl was born in Irwin and had lived in Des Moines for more than 50 years before moving to Naples in 2000. He was a retired executive vice-president with the Iowa Auto Dealers Association. He was an Army veteran of World War II and had been awarded the Bronze Star with an Oak Leaf Cluster and Air Medal. He also served in the Army Reserve. He was a member of St. John Episcopal Church in Naples, the American Legion, Za Ga Zig Shrine and the U.S. Retired Officers Association. He was a former commissioner of Iowa Public Safety.

Alfred Kahl was a generous contributor to the Irwin Community, Irwin Chamber of Commerce, Irwin Cemetery, Irwin Community Building, Irwin playground, Irwin Museum, gazebo and park benches.

He is survived by his wife, Margaret; a daughter, Karlin Kahl of Naples; a son, John of Naples; and two grandchildren.
