## Margaret D. Larsen, 87 Jan. 25, 1907 - Jan. 8, 1995

She was a charter member of the First Baptist Church in Harlan and a 50 year member of the Lebanon Chapter No. 8, Order of Eastern Star as well as a member of Daughters of the Nile and the Shelby County Garden Club. She died Jan. 8, 1995 at the Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 87 years, 11 months and 14 days.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by two sisters, Ruby Petersen and Jeanette Larsen. She is survived by a daughter, Jean (Donald) Christensen of Harlan; two grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; two sisters, Florence Andersen of Brayton and Virginia
