daughter of Anton and Veronica
(Kloewer) Rau was born March 21,
1928 near Earling. She died Nov.
13, 1993 at Myrtue Memorial
Hospital at age 65 years, seven
months and 23 days. She was
baptized, received her First Holy
Communion and was confirmed at
St. Joseph's Catholic Church in
Earling, and attended St. Joseph's
Grade and High School where she
graduated in 1945.

Nov. 23, 1948, she married Arthur N. Leinen at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Earling. Seven children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Portsmouth until 1954, when they moved to Co. Bluffs where

they would make their home for the next 36 years. After the death of her husband in 1990, she continued to reside in Co. Bluffs until 1991, when she moved to Harlan, and this has been her home since that time. She was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church while residing in Co. Bluffs, and was presently a member of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan. She was also a member of the Catholic Daughters of America, St. Katherine's Court, #266 of Earling.
