MANNING — Mabel Wilhelmina, daughter of Henry and Anna Arp Frank, was born May 27, 1905, near Irwin in Shelby County. After her graduation from Irwin High School, she enrolled in normal training at Storm Lake. For three years she taught in the rural schools in the Irwin area.

On June 24, 1925, she married Bernard Alfred Lengemann at her parents home near Irwin. One daughter, Betty was born to this union. They resided on farms near Gray, Coon Rapids and Manning and retired from farming and moved to Manning in 1971. Her husband died unexpectedly in 1985. She remained in her home until Dec. of 1986. She was hospitalized at that time and then moved to the Manilla Manor nursing home. She died at St. Anthony hospital, Sept. 26, 1987 at age 82 years, 3 months and 29 days.

Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents and her sister, Agnes Kuchel. Survivors include her daughter, Betty (Mrs Louie) Andresen of Manning; three granddaughters; and nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were Sept. 28, 1987 at Ohde Funeral Home, Manning with Pastor Sushil Joseph of United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was in the Manning City cemetery with Jerome Kasperbauer, Roger Vollstedt, Delton Gruhn, Melvin Kusel, Lawrence Sporrer and Russell Mohr serving as casket bearers. Honorary bearers were Virgil Genzen, Charles Gruhn and Merle Stoelk.
