After the death of his wife March 27, 1939, he continued to farm until 1953 when he moved to Co. Bluffs after her death March 28. 1968. He always maintained an interest in the farm in Shelby County and his cattle ranch in SD. He continued to handle his business until he was injured in an automobile accident Oct. 2, 1992. Feb. 25, 1993, he became a resident of the Little Flower Haven Nursing Home in Earling, after an extended hospital stay. This is where he died April 24, 1994 at age 89 years and 27 days. He was a member of Holy Family Catholic Church in Co. Bluffs, the Knights of Columbus, Earling Council #1741 and charter member of the Luke E. Hart General Assembly 4th Degree Knights of Columbus and its Chalice Club. He was a past Grand Knight, past district deputy and advocate of the Earling Council. He had also been an active member of the Colonial Manor Nursing Home Board of Directors in Oakland, and was presently an honorary director. He had also been a member of the State Board of Concerned Citizens for Improvement and active in Soil Conservation. He was also a member of the Elk's Lodge #531 and a past member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge, both of Co. Bluffs.

In addition to his parents and wives, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Lester and Alfred and a sister Agatha Meyers. He is survived by his children - Cletus (Virginia) Lickteig of Denison; Sr. Raymarie Lickteig of Co.
